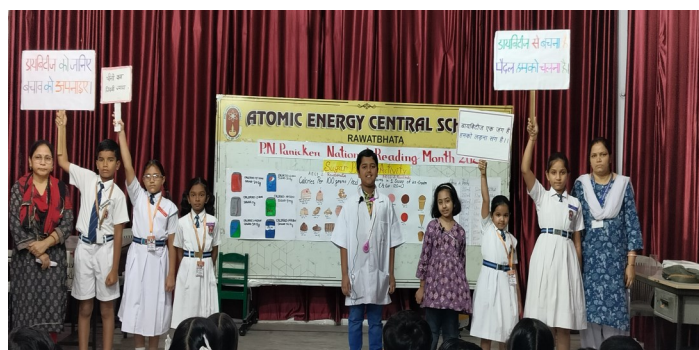
All India Inter AECS/ AEJC music competition

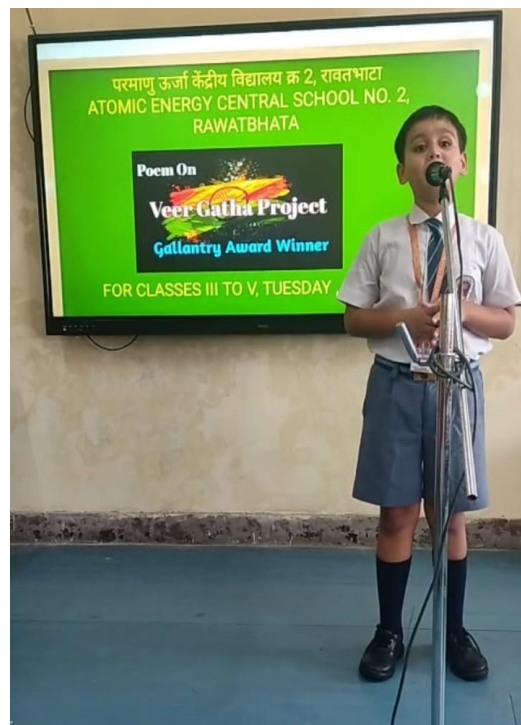


Project veer Gatha 5.0

As per the CBSE Academic circular received in September all CBSE-affiliated schools were requested to participate in Project Veer Gatha. 5.0. This initiative by the Ministry of Education and the Minister of Defence aims to instill patriotism, civic awareness, and respect for the gallant acts of India's brave soldiers.

The objective of participation was to engage students creatively in understanding and expressing the stories of bravery of India's heroes through poems, essays, drawings and multimedia presentation. And to submit the best entries on the MyGov portal as instructed.

A Screening Committee of teachers evaluated all submissions based on creativity, relevance, accuracy, presentation quality and adherence to guidelines. After careful evaluation six best entries were selected as the best representation of students' creativity and understanding of Veer Gatha themes. The selected poems and PPTs were uploaded in a timely manner on the MyGov portal, in accordance with CBSE instructions and within the stipulated timeline.

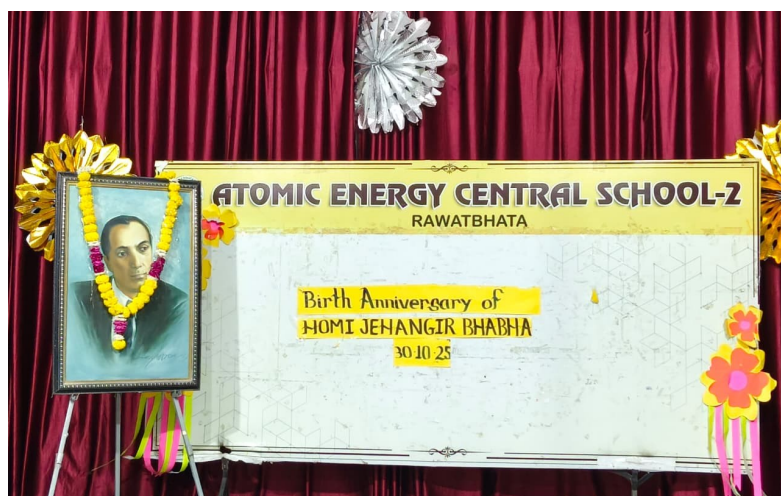
Swachhotsav 2025

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Springdales Children's School, Kota on September 18th 2025.

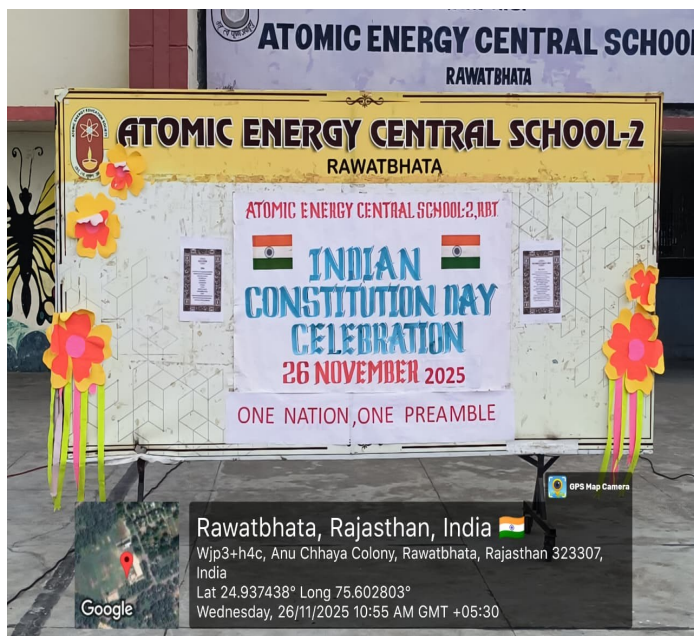

External exams conducted in our school during the session 2025-26
