First and foremost, I take great pride in welcoming our Chief Guest. I am deeply indebted to Shri D Subba Rao sir who despite his busiest schedule has accepted our invitation and graced the occasion by his benign presence.

I consider it as my noble duty to introduce our chief guest of the day to this august gathering.

Shri Dasari Subba Rao obtained his B.Tech. in Mechanical Engineering from JNTU, Anantapur in 1989. He joined Nuclear Power Corporation of India Limited (NPCIL) as a Trainee on 19th September 1989, in the first batch of Executive Trainees. After successful completion of training, he began his career as Scientific Officer/C at KAPS, thereby embarking on a distinguished professional journey in nuclear power operations.

During his tenure as Maintenance Superintendent at KGS-1&2, Shri Subba Rao made significant contributions in ensuring operational reliability, including the achievement of 962 days' continuous operation of KGS-1 and making world record of continuous safe and reliable operation which is a record in NPCIL Stations operating history.

Subsequently, as a Chief Superintendent at RAPP-7&8, he was instrumental in establishing maintenance shops and laboratories, and played a vital role in the successful completion of RAPP-7 PHT Hydro test in a shortest period of time (November 2021).

As a Station Director of RAPS-3&4, Rehabilitation and life extension of RAPS-3, he provided exemplary leadership in the execution of works such as EMCCR, EMFR, and LSD of RAPS-3, along with several system upgradations. These were accomplished with a strong emphasis on safety, reliability, and cost-effectiveness in the entire period of EMCCR & EMFR Project.

His leadership at RAPS-3&4 brought about notable performance improvements, including enhancement of the WANO Performance Indicator from 94.6% to 98.8% and also prestigious achievement of WANO rating 2. The station also earned five National Safety Awards—two Silver Awards from the National Safety Council and one Award from Apex forum of India Platinum award and Golden Peacock Award from Institute of Directors (I)- a testimony to his commitment to safety, security and operational excellence.

IOQM (Indian Olympiad Qualifier Examination in Mathematics)- Special coaching classes for the Indian Olympiad Qualifier Examination in Mathematics were conducted for students of classes VIII to X from 17th July to 3rd September. These sessions were effectively facilitated by Mr. N.K. Sharma and Mrs. C.B. Meena with a total of 40 students attended these special classes. The IOQM examination was conducted in our school on 7th of September Out of 43 registered students. 36 students appeared for the examination.
